



COVID-19 Resources – Manchester

	Food for Children	JFK Coliseum, Saturdays 9am Protocol 1) Volunteers and patrons must wear gloves at all times. 2) All volunteers and patrons to wear gloves at all times. 3) All tables are sanitized at beginning and end of day. 4) Line to commence asap following setup and there will be no message from the back of the truck. No crowd gathering. 5) There will be sanitizing stations set up at the beginning of the line and halfway through. 6) Tables are to be set up two deep, and there is a minimum of ten feet separating each station/department providing for a one line approach for patrons and an approximate six foot buffer for volunteers. 7) Volunteers	

	are to avoid any physical contact with each other or patrons and do their best to maintain a safe distance. 8) Patrons will be limited to 3-5 per station/department as they proceed through the line. 9) Using chalk or washable paint, the patron waiting area will be divided into 60 - 6 foot individual zones, 6 zones across the front of the line and 10 zones deep and be physically monitored for adherence to proper social distancing.
